



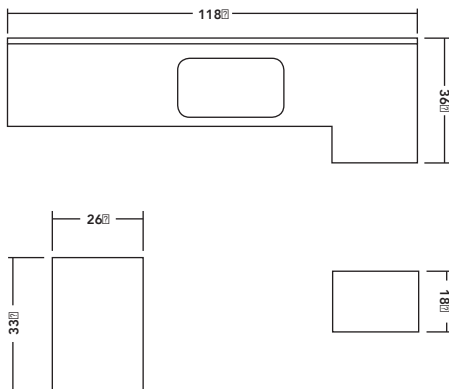
Measuring Your Countertop

Use the grid below to sketch out your countertop. Make sure to make notes of things that you might not be sure about.

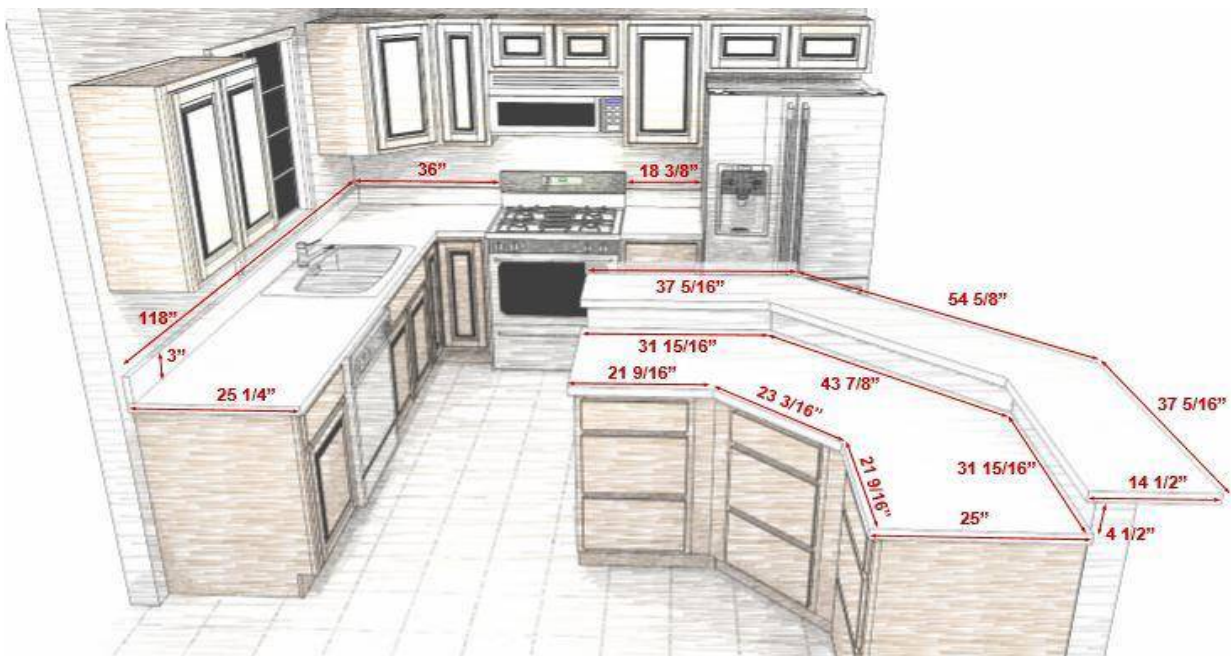
A large grid of light blue lines on a white background, intended for sketching a countertop. The grid is approximately 30 units wide and 40 units high.

Measuring Your Countertop

Measuring for your new countertop does **NOT** have to be complicated! The basic process involves measuring the various lengths of your existing tops from one end to the other, and in some cases checking their widths (front to back, if they are wider or narrower than the others in the kitchen). Being exact isn't critical, just do your best! The new countertops will always be laser measured to exact dimensions by our professionals here at StoneMark before they are fabricated and installed.



1. Measure the lengths as they follow along the wall.
2. Check the depths from the nose of the counter all the way back to the wall.
3. If you have a peninsula, make sure you measure from the wall out to the furthest point, AND measure the width across the widest point.
4. A rectangular island can just be measured by length and width, but a more complex island shape should also include all perimeter lengths.
5. Measure an existing backsplash that's either connected to the counter (or simply attached to the top of it) from the top of the counter to its highest point.
6. Make simple notes as to the various locations of appliances or sinks.
